We set out to re-distribute funds and resources to communities and individuals who have lost opportunities, access, and jobs due to COVID. Specifically, we focused on the Global South, and in particular, low-income people of colour, underemployed or unemployed older people (50+), and single-mother households.



At TSL, we understand that all systems of oppression are interlinked. Without money, opportunity, access, and representation, those who are not seen in the mainstream or in positions of power are further left behind, while those who were lucky with the circumstances of their birth can increasingly reach higher mobility at the expense of marginalized people.



We launched our COVID-19 relief fund to provide assistance to those who were especially affected by the pandemic. We launched our fundraiser, receiving grants from generous donors and TSL members around the world, with the aim of redistributing our funds to those most in need.
